CAMPING DURING A PANDEMIC





In the context of COVID-19, **everyone** is **responsible** for practicing the safety/prevention measures and behaviours. Campground operators have implemented operating procedures in order to ensure that people follow the Public Health recommendations designed to prevent the spread of the virus. As a **camper**, you have an important role to play in achieving this objective.

You have been given this document so you can learn the measures you must comply with as a camper, whether you're a **seasonal or short-term visitor**. You may be given more information upon your arrival, for example, concerning the campground's regulations which had to be adapted in the context of COVID-19. It is **important** that you share this information with **every** person included in your reservation, young and old alike.

The campground staff encourages you to help them in their efforts to ensure safe and respectful cohabitation for everyone on the campground.



Before you arrive, be well informed and well equipped!

- In view of government guidelines, some services or activities may not be accessible. To avoid disappointments, keep informed by consulting the campground's website or by contacting the campground directly.

 Consult this link to know the alert level and the measures in force in the area where the campground is located. If the level differs from that of your place of residence, the more stringent of the two applies.
- Make your payment in advance, if possible.
- Plan to have a sufficient supply of soap and alcohol-based hand sanitizer.
- Bring cleaning and disinfecting supplies, such as disinfecting wipes, to use on frequently touched surfaces.
- Bring and wear a face covering.
- Bring a tablecloth for your picnic table.

If you are showing signs of COVID-19, do not attend the campground. Self-isolate, contact Public Health at 1-877-644-4545 and follow their instructions.



When you arrive, be civic-minded, patient and courteous!

- Follow the rules and obey the **signs** and markers designed to ensure physical distancing of two meters between each person.
- Report to the welcome station **alone**. Your companions must wait for you outside or remain in the vehicle.
- Disinfect your hands using the sinks or alcohol-based hand sanitizer provided by the campground.
- Wear a **face covering** at the welcome station.
- If you must make your payment on site, pay by card.

During your stay, comply with the hygiene and social-distancing measures and regulations in place

Basic hygiene rules



- Obey the distancing rule of two meters between each person.
- Wash your hands frequently in warm soapy water for at least 20 seconds.
- · Avoid shaking hands.
- Cover your mouth and nose with your elbow or a tissue when you cough or sneeze.
- Avoid touching your face with unwashed hands.
- Dispose of your tissues in the garbage.
- Face covers are mandatory for people 10 years or older:
 - -In all inside common areas.
 - -In all outside common areas when it is impossible to maintain physical distancing at all times between
- people from different residences.

Sanitary facilities



As much as possible, use your own sanitary facilities.

- Help the campground staff keep sanitary blocks clean.
- Carry your dirty laundry in a waterproof bag.
 Obey the guidelines and signs.
- If necessary, keep disinfecting wipes on hand and
- discard used wipes in the garbage cans and not the toilets.

Maintain your equipment (



 Frequently touched surfaces and objects are more susceptible to contamination. They must be <u>cleaned and disinfected</u> at least twice per day or as frequently as possible.

Pets



It is recommended to avoid contact with other people's pets and to limit contact between pets from different households. Pets must be kept on a leash at all times.

Gatherings, restricted areas and events (🔆



If the alert level differs from that of your place of residence, the more stringent of the two applies.

At campsites

Outside:

- Red, orange and yellow alert level: 8 people or occupants of 2 residences (distancing)
- -Green alert level: maximum 10 people or occupants of 3 residences (distancing)

Inside

- Red and orange alert level: prohibited
- Yellow alert level: maximum occupants of 2 residences (distancing and mask)

Green alert level: maximum 10 people or occupants of 3 residences (distancing and mask)

Common outside areas

- Red alert level: 8 people (distancing and mask)
- Orange alert level: 12 people (distancing and mask)
- Yellow alert level: 12 people (distancing)
- Green alert level: 50 people (distancing)

If during your stay, you develop symptoms of COVID-19:

- Self-isolate in your recreational equipment, wash your hands and wear a mask.
- Notify the campground operator.
- Contact the COVID-19 information line at 1-877-644-4545 and follow their instructions, particularly regarding your departure from the campground and vour return home.
